


FOREVER IN AN INSTANT **ANDREA MILANO**








SANDRA BARNEDA








PATRICIA TRUFELLO

SYNOPSIS



SYNOPSIS




MOTHER FUCKER








MIRTA PEREZ


SYNOPSIS

SYNOPSIS

Madrid, 1901: the young writer Lorenzo Hernández is trying to make a living by writing society articles. One afternoon he is commissioned to narrate the adventures of Victoria, an enigmatic and seductive woman that everyone talks about, but no one really knows. What may seem like just another job becomes a personal challenge that will drag this journalist into the underworld of a city that holds many secrets.


Hand in hand with Victoria, Lorenzo will enter a world in which politicians, businessmen and the wealthy enjoy fun and eccentric nights out in the city's luxury bars, away from a gloomy and decadent reality that moves a few streets away from the centre.

SYNOPSIS

The Infanta María de Avís, the richest woman in Portugal, is dying in Lisbon. As she reaches her final hour, she reminisces about her life, a succession of palace and political intrigues that thwarted her marriage engagements, one after another, and above all, her great love story.

Far from there, in the powerful monastery of Santa María de Flor da Rosa, several crimes are being committed. Brother Atilio's investigations connect them to the death of a young herbalist and the birth of a girl with a butterfly-shaped mark. This little girl will grow up with the family of a Jewish doctor persecuted by the Inquisition, and some time later will become the brilliant helper of Nuno, the apothecary, until an Avís crosses her path.

The Cursed Lineage is a vivid story strewn with betrayal and power struggles, forbidden loves and mysterious deaths. A novel about the destiny of noble women and common women, all of them tools in the hands of the powerful.





MARIA JAEN

As a screenwriter, she has participated in television series such as Sitges or El cor de la ciutat and films such as Pau, La força d'un silenci (2017) or La vampira de Barcelona (2020)



DEAR PABLO

Plaza & Janes (Spanish) October 2021 Pages: 224 Love and stormy passions, with Bach suites for cello as a soundtrack. A timeless portrait of a great woman who had to grapple with the rigid conventions of her time. It will delight readers of Rafael Nadal, Maria Barbal or Jaume Cabré.

SYNOPSIS

Pau Casals swore he would never set foot in Catalonia under Francisco Franco's dictatorship, but broke his oath to bury Francesca Vidal. At the time, the media referred to her as his "housekeeper". This novel is a portrait of the woman who shared the hardest years of the musician's life, in exile and while persecuted by the Nazis. A great love story in turbulent times. Maria Jaén delves into the story of Francesca, who was born into a family of artists, but abandoned her passion for the cello and her country to live by Casals' side: one of the geniuses of all times. An exciting novel that reconstructs a tragic era - in the midst of the Civil War and World War II - and shows how its protagonist bravely claims her place in the world.





CLARA FUENTES

Clara Fuertes (Burgos), a prolific author, she has published six titles since writing her first successful novel, *Agua de limón*. Clara lives immersed in writing and is passionate about creative teaching, art and travel: she has lived in several cities across Spain and in Florence and writes short texts about everyday life, love, history and women. In *Todas las horas del día* she pays homage to actress María Casares, one of the great performers of the 20th century, in honor of her hundredth birthday.

1990: Airas, a young Galician journalist, is assigned to cover the awarding of the French National Theatre Award to actress María Casares. Over sixty years old, María, still active, resides in a large house in the French countryside, where she lives with the ghosts of her two great loves: Albert Camus, her lover, and André "Dadé" Schlesser, her best friend and alter husband. Airas's Galician accent and striking resemblance to Camus prompts María to relive certain feelings she thought were long-forgotten, and to reconstruct her personal and professional story, from the time she left Spain when she was fourteen at the outset of the Spanish Civil War, up until the point that she became one of the most influential figures in French theatre: an unrepeatable life marked by the sea and by exile, by love and solitude.







SYNOPSIS


In 1997 they were friends and classmates at a high school in Alcorcón. Five years later they are almost strangers, but they have set a date to meet again at a dinner party. Looking at the past helps to recognise the miseries of the present, and this is what happens to these seven protagonists. The weeks leading up to the reunion become a pathetic and hilarious race against the clock to cover up their embarrassments. It is difficult to be less old, to get rid of cellulite or to have a better valued job in a matter of days, but no one wants to burst into tears when they are asked: "How are you doing?

The novel travels between 1997 and 2022 to give us a better picture of this group of disoriented, ridiculous adults, who are bogged down by their supposed failures. Only Vero, nicknamed the 'weird one', is different from them all. She is strong, funny, independent and the only one who genuinely faces a serious problem. Ideas para parecer feliz is a hilarious novel, but also an existential reflection on the past and on the things that make us happy.





GETTING TO KNOW EACH OTHER AGAIN

Ediciones B February 2022 Pages: 304 This is the story of a father and a son who could be anyone, with the noisy silences, the secrets spoken out loud and the subtleties that make the most intimate relationships also the most complicated.

SYNOPSIS

Hugo is seven years old, and his parents are getting divorced. While they decide the terms of the separation, his father and the protagonist of this novel reflects on the time he hasn't spent with him, on how much he has delegated to Hugo's mother, and how little he actually knows him. This brings him to the understanding that, in this new routine—now shared just by the two of them—he must win him back, something he will do through literature. This is a tiny love story that shows us how we can win when we think we're about to lose everything. 






JON SISTIAGA

He cut his teeth as a journalist during the worst years of terrorism in the Basque Country, and his reports have always delved into the ultimate reasons for using and justifying the use of violence. 

Through a fast-paced narrative that underlies the need for both reconciliation and remembering, The Last Gudari unfolds several plots that converge unexpectedly, like pieces of a delicate puzzle, in an inescapable ending.
