



Grants for the translation of works originally written in Catalan or Aranese

PURPOSE: Translation of works originally written in Catalan or Occitan (in its Aranese variety): fiction, poetry, drama, graphic novels, non-fiction, works in the Humanities field and children's books.

RECIPIENTS: These grants are available to Spanish and foreign publishers, self-employed individuals and legal entities. The applicants must meet the following requirements and conditions:

publish the work after the date of the final resolution until November 30 of the following year

hold the rights to publish the work

publish the work in print format and distribute it commercially through bookshops (online publications, print on demand and self-publishing are excluded)

Applicants can submit up to a maximum of two applications per call.

GRANT-SUPPORTED EXPENDITURE: Only the translator's fees are considered grant-supported expenditure. In the case of poetry anthologies, the anthologist's fees are also considered grant-funded expenditure.

APPLICATION SUBMISSION:

- -Online: Spanish applicants, self-employed individuals and legal entities.
- -Online:Foreign applicants (self-employed individuals and legal entities) who have applied for a grant to the Institut Ramon Llull in the past.
- Foreign applicants (self-employed individuals and legal entities) requesting an Institut Ramon Llull grant for the first time. In this case, accreditation is required. When filling out the accreditation form you must select "Literature and Thought" as the recipient department.

The accreditation (user and password) is valid for five years from the date of issue, unless there is some change in the documents provided, of which the IRL must be informed.

Please take into account that you should request your accreditation at least 48 hours before the application deadline.

APPLICATION DATES: First Call: From February 13th to April 27th, 2023; Second Call: From May 2nd to June 29th, 2023; Third Call: From July 3rd to November 6th, 2023

SUBSTANTIATING THE GRANT:

The applicant must substantiate at least 80% of the requested (and eligible) amount in order to receive the awarded grant, or the grant will be revoked.








AINA GATNAU

La Campana March 2022 Pages: 184 An intimate novel about a woman's fight to become happy and move past the events that have cast a shadow over her life.

SYNOPSIS

Teenage Mercè lives in a house in the country with her family and friends. Her life is happy and innocent, until one day, when a day-laborer on their property rapes her. How do you go on living after a rape? "No matter how much you move, leave, flee, the story you're running from will stick with you like a needle in your chest," the protagonist says.

Distraught and humiliated, Mercè decides to leave for France, where she moves in with relatives to help with their daily house chores. Her desire to overcome this trauma by herself, and the joy she takes in sewing, will lead her to move to Paris a few years later and start her very own dressmaking shop. It's there that she'll meet Jules, the love of her life.







CINTA FARNÓS

CINTA FARNÓS (El Perelló, 1986) is a political scientist and writer and most recently, has worked on policies of democratic memory for the Generalitat of Catalunya.

Geosmina is her first novel. She has previously written short stories – one of which was published by the Tarragona Literary Awards – and gastronomic guides. She is a contributor to the magazine Núvol, where she writes opinion and criticism pieces.

La Magrana January 2022 Pages: 240 A novel that explains the intimist, physical and vital journey of a girl who, following the sudden death of her mother, needs to find answers to a childhood without maternal ties.

SYNOPSIS

Llúcia, who lives in Ireland and has just broken up with Liam, receives a call from her father: Blanca, her mother, has suddenly died in a car accident. She returns home to the Ebro village of her childhood, adolescence and early youth, where she has to face not only the death of her mother, but also her memories and the relationship between mother and daughter.

When she decides to retrace the journey to Asturias that her mother had planned to make before her death, Llúcia is unaware that it will also be a journey into her

past in which she will find paths of life full of rejections, secrets and escapes that will make her question her past and her present.








NÚRIA PERPINYÀ FILELLA

SYNOPSIS

We are in the 23rd century and the world has created an almost perfect Society, despite the terrible threat of climate change. Storms and floods cause great calamities and, with a demagogic speech that was soon applauded, the scientist Bekele Jenklin, who saw his son drown by drowning, even convinces environmentalists with a radical solution: eliminate water and clouds.



SYNOPSIS

Year 1978. In Vilavella, a town in the Empordà, Nandu Sureda, the last Francoist mayor, moves all the strings of a regime that is dying to push forward a large urbanization that will destroy an area of wetlands, key to the migration of many birds. Genís Amer, a young ornithologist, leads the opposition to the project with the help of local political parties that, even so, seem more interested in the imminent first democratic municipal elections than in the environmental struggle.








CLÀUDIA COSTAS GÜELL

SYNOPSIS



Joana, the third daughter of the couple, does not want to go because she has just separated and the family does not know, but she does not feel strong enough to explain it to her mother, with whom she has never had a good relationship. His three brothers also come to the summer house, each with their own personal circumstances. The meeting ends up becoming a turbulent weekend in which the conflicts of the present and the past coexist and secrets hidden throughout the years emerge.

After dedicating himself professionally to the textile and fashion sector, he decides to make a change of direction in his life and devote himself to writing. A novel that shows how three women face life with their virtues and flaws, the secrets they hide and the dreams they chase. A novel that has all the ingredients to be a success.








NURIA FORTUNY CIRAC

A romantic comedy, filled with relatable characters and places. An addictive plot that cannot be put down until the end. A perfect read for beach days.








NEUS VERDAGUER PAGES/ VICTOR JOSE DIAZ GOMEZ

A mix of eroticism, sensuality, flirting, and romanticism in an idyllic setting that seduces the reader from the first page.








VICTORIA FERNANDEZ








ASCEN CAPEL

Lola's father owns a knitting shop in a town during the twenties. From a very young age, she helped him with the accounting and transporting of the material. The rest of the town doesn't like the idea of her working; they consider it too hard a job for a woman. When they need to use a truck in the weaving shop, she takes out her truck driver's license, without considering everyone's mockery. But business isnt going well and Lola has to make a decision that will change her life. How far will she be able to go to save her father's business? Collaborator of media such as Diari de Barcelona. El Periódico. Deia or El País, he has translated works by Albert Sánchez Piñol and Carles Porta into Spanish. With the book La Sisena Flota a Barcelona, he won the Josep Maria Huertas Clavería Journalism Award in 2010. In 2017, he won the Josep Pla Narrative Award with the novel La fada negra, a historical thriller set in Barcelona in 1843.




THE FRONTIER

SYNOPSIS




Between Menorca and Constantinople, a young slave fights for her freedom.

A story of intrigue and humor where the reader will enjoy solving the crime and discovering who is hiding behind the protagonists.








JORDI COLL

SYNOPSIS

In Sureny, a small town in Pallars Sobirà, nine-year-old Alèxia has disappeared. The whole town assembles to search for her. During the investigation they find a murdered boy, buried naked, in the middle of the forest. Someone has cut his throat. Nothing bodes well. Where is little Alexia? The last time they saw her was when she was leaving the rehearsal of the play Els Pastorets, but that day she did not return home. The person in charge of investigating the case will be inspector Renée Colomé, a tough woman with an impeccable professional career in the force. A novel where mystery and intrigue keep the reader on the edge of their seat throughout the plot, and with a surprising and completely unexpected outcome.

THE SENTINELS OF FREEDOM





Carles Riba is thirty-four years old and Clementina Arderiu is thirty-eight when they embark on the trip to Greece. A writer "by profession and vocation cannot do without Greece." These words, spoken by Carles Riba himself, faithfully and simply summarize the extreme motivation of the "unforgettable trip to Greece, to recognize the landscapes of so many authors loved and translated by me", of the "unforgettable solitary trip." 
ANTONI SIMÓN

THE CORPUS OF BLOOD

Rosa dels Vents September 2023 Pages: 256 The living and bloody story of the revolt that caused the rupture between Catalonia and the Spanish monarchy.

SYNOPSIS

On June 7, 1640, a revolt led by a mass of reapers who entered Barcelona ended the life of Dalmau de Queralt, count of Santa Coloma and viceroy of Catalonia. The already very tense relations between the Catalan institutions and the Court of Madrid then entered a fission point of no return, culminating in a revolutionary process that would lead to the separation of Catalonia and the Spanish monarchy. The historian Antoni Simon offers us a lively and detailed account of those days of revolt that culminated with the *Corpus de Sang* day, one of the most notorious episodes in the history of Catalonia.
