

How did this magical mix of people come together; you may well be asking?

Chomsky & Muiica is a title born out of a weekend of conversation.



Saúl Alvídrez

Originally from Chihuahua. Mexico, Saúl Alvídrez Ruiz is an activist and filmmaker. In 2012 he founded #YoSov132: the most important student-based social movement in Mexico since 1968. This political activism made him a direct target of harassment, death threats, and fraudulently fabricated media scandals from the Mexican government.

Given this context, Alvídrez decided to go into exile in South America. Following this, he won first place in a social entrepreneurship contest in Ecuador with a computer project inspired by Julian Assange, and later began directing and producing a documentary with former Uruguayan President José Pepe Mujica and American intellectual Noam Chomsky.





BELÉN GOPEGUI

Belén Gopegui was born in Madrid in 1963. She studied Law at the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid and received a doctorate in Humanities from the Carlos III University. In 1993, she published her first novel, *The Scale of Maps*, and since has published *The cold side of the pillow* (2004), *Snow White's father* (2007), *Desire to be punk* (2009), *Unauthorized Access* (2011), *The Committee of the Night* (2014), *Stay This Day and Night With Me* (2017).

Her most recent novel, We Could be The Sea, was published in 2021, and her non-fiction title El murmullo was published in January 2023.

She has been awarded many literary prizes for her work and Francisco Umbral considers her the best writer of her generation. Aside from novels, she has written newspaper articles, movie scripts, plays, and essays.

Throughout her long career, Belén Gopegui has used her novels and essays both to represent reality and, at the same time, to question structures of power and the hegemonic socio-economic order.

She invites the reader to take a step, however small, from simply thinking about a more just society to actively working towards it.


Her work has been translated into various languages, including English, French, German and Dutch, to name just a few.















THE MURMUR

An essay on self-help loaded with Gopegui's intelligence and social sensitivity


SYNOPSIS

A rising murmur of loneliness and anguish can be heard, at times, in the self-help book sections. The stories those books tell are not far from fiction.

Although not always, they often contain false promises, and there is one that is repeated: shortcuts will appear to solve certain problems, suddenly it will no longer be necessary to go through the collective organization, necessary and costly in terms of strength, patience and resources. Is it possible not to ignore that murmur, that desire, and respond with arguments that don't lie?

For her doctorate, the novelist Belén Gopegui immersed herself in self-help literature and wrote the thesis that gives rise to the two parts of this essay: on the one hand, a small study of the genre from the point of view of fiction; on the other, as an experiment, a serene and perceptive manual for the use of mild silent despair.

Far from academic, *The Murmur* is an unclassifiable book that combines a political and philosophical gaze with a dazzling ability to assemble, disarm, and understand some mechanisms of human behavior in pages of intelligent and strange beauty.







JAVIER GOMÁ

Javier Gomá, the winner of the Spanish National Essay Prize in 2004, proposes the concept of leading by example as a necessary organizing principle of modern democracy.

Javier Gomá Lanzón was born in Bilbao in 1965. He has a doctor's degree in Philosophy and was graduated in Classic Philology and Law. Since 2003, he has been the director of the Juan March Foundation.

By Imitation and Experience, the first book of his famous four part series that looks at the key concepts around leading by example, won the National Essay Prize 2004.

In 2012, he was named one of the fifty most influential intellectuals in the Spanish-speaking world by the magazine Foreign Policy (in Spanish).

A philosopher who has received praise from intellectual greats such as Zygmunt Bauman and Joseph Weiler, Gomá is one of the greatest thinkers and writers of our modern day.

Each book in his four-part series is autonomous and can be read independently, and, at the same time, the four of them are part of a unitary plan that revolves around the idea of leading by example.

The titles are listed below:


- 1. **Imitation and Experience**: an analysis of the tradition of classic concepts of culture such as model, example or imitation to narrate the theory of leading by example
- 2. **Achilles in the Gynaeceum**: Achilles leaves immortality behind to head to the battlefield of Troy where he knew he was going to die. Gomá argues we must all walk that same path from gynaecium to Troy, to learn to be mortal in order to be individual
- 3. **Leading by Example:** the ideal of leading by example as an organizing principle of democracy
- 4. **Necessary but Impossible:** the question of hope for personal survival

SYNOPSIS

The book proposes the ideal of leading by example, in an egalitarian and secularized manner, as an organizing principle of democracy in the belief that, in this post-nihilistic era, in which authoritarianism and coercion have lost their cohesive power, only the persuasive force of the virtuous example, generator of civic customs, will be able to promote the genuine emancipation of the citizen.

Leading by Example forms part of a tetralogy in which four texts sit along aside one another to make up a unitary plan that revolves around the idea of leading by example.

An **English translation of Leading by Example** is available **free of charge**, for commercial publication, by Thomas Mermall, professor at the New York Graduate Center.


The translation was completed (chapters 27 - 30) by Lane Kauffman, professor at Rice University, and revised by Professor Jorge Brioso, of Carleton College.






JOSÉ MARÍA RUIZ VARGAS


SYNOPSIS

SYNOPSIS

A Shared History is a personal and historical look at the role of women throughout history, told in an engaging manner that captures the reader from the very beginning.





JOSÉ ENRIQUE RUIZ-DOMÈNEC

José Enrique Ruiz-Domènec (Granada, Spain, 1948) is a distinguished academic with a multitude of talents and achievements.

In the academic world, he has worked at the Autonomous University of Barcelona for over forty years as Director of the Institute of Medieval Studies and is currently visiting Professor in Medieval History at the Università degli Studi Suor Orsola Benincasa in Naples.

He is a distinguished lecturer at: the Collège de France de Paris (at the express invitation of Georges Duby), the Iberoamericana of Mexico, the Orientale in Naples, the Universities of de Granada, Navarre, Ljubljana, Rijeka Palermo, Messina, Turin, Adolfo Ibáñez Universityin Chile, Los Andes University in Bogotá, Casa de América and Casa Árabe in Madrid, and the Escola Europea in Barcelona.

José Enrique Ruiz-Domènec holds a numbered seat at the European Academy in London, the Reial Acadèmia de Bones Lletres in Bacelona, the Royal Academy of Doctors of Catalonia, the Círculo del Liceo, and is a Paul Harris fellow Representative of Spain on the European Commission in the French government initiative "27 Historians for Europe".

As a curator, he oversaw the renovation of Colombia's Colonial Museum and served as an expert consultant for a number of exhibitions.


As a writer, he regularly contributes to the culture pages of El País, ABC, and La Vanguardia. He has published more than three hundred articles.

He has published some fifty books in Spanish, French, Italian, English, German, and Catalan, including a successful biography of Columbus (Einaudi) that has gone through multiple editions, an essay on Europe (Editions Saint-Simon de Paris, finalist for the Gran Prix du Livre Européen given by the Council of Europe), *The Day After the Great Epidemics* (Taurus, Rosa del Vents, 2020), which has gone through several editions and received acclaim in Europe and the Americas.

Brief extract:

The stories of the Mediterranean are unique and valuable, even if we do little to celebrate them, to appreciate their subtlety and elegant plots. The sadly famous Peloponnesian war, which made the name of Thucydides, the man who chronicled it, showed how cruel the rage of our neighbors can be, and we have seen this rage repeated through the centuries every time a people feels the need to establish hegemony, creating empires that wind up vanishing soon after, leaving behind a mere boot print on hills covered in olive trees.

Today, the poetry of Homer and the histories of Thucydides are a brief footnote in a schoolbook, mixed with other, less estimable works. For two decades, she has devoted her research to the study of Women's History, a field of study that she came to because of her interest in assessing the role of women who lived in the city.



BEING A MOTHER IN THE MIDDLE AGES

SYNOPSIS

To understand motherhood in the 21st century, this title makes us look at the past; a trip to the Middle Ages where we find the roots of practices that have survived to this day.

María Jesús Fuente, a historian with a deep knowledge of the subject, approaches motherhood in an extremely original and exciting way, and demonstrates the extent to which a book on the Middle Ages can bring new air to current debates and concerns.


Immersing in motherhood in this millennium requires plural and multifaceted sources with which to analyse how mothers were and why they were that way. For this we have used religious, medical, literary and iconographic sources.

This information, however, is not easy to collect, perhaps because of the intimate nature of this subject, perhaps because of the lack of voice in the majority of its protagonists, the women, or perhaps because of the dominance of religion in all the personal and social facets of life.

In fact, we could affirm that motherhood and faith went hand in hand and that this can be seen in the three religions of the Mediterranean: Christianity, Judaism and Islam.

The desire to be a mother, the lack of it, breastfeeding, childbirth, postpartum or parenting in general are some of the issues that make up this original essay, which allows us to contemplate, with the clarity of distance, aspects which are currently being debated with great ardor.

Based on the historical account, the author helps to blur emotional, ideological or costumbrist layers that often blur reality.







CARLOS GRANÉS

Carlos Granés, Bogotá (1975) – Essayist and doctor of social anthropology (Complutense University of Madrid); winner of the Extraordinary Doctorate Award.

In 2003-2004, he received a fellowship at the University of California, Berkeley. He is the author of *La revancha de la imaginación* (CSIC, 2008); *El puño invisible:* Arte Revolución y un siglo de cambios culturales, published by Taurus and winner of the 2011 Isabel Polanco International Essay Prize; and *La invención del paraíso: El Living Theatre y el arte de la osadía*, also published by Taurus in 2015.

He has collected Mario Vargas Llosa's writings on Latin American culture and politics, which can be found in *Sables y Utopías: Visiones de América Latina*, and on libraries and education, which can be found in *Elogio de la educación*.






DANIEL SAMPER PIZANO






JAVIFR MOSCOSO

Javier Moscoso (Madrid, Spain, 1966) is a research professor at the Spanish National Research Council's History Institute.

A doctor of philosophy, he has been a researcher and visiting professor at Harvard University, University of Chicago, University of Paris I Sorbonne and, most recently, the Max Planck Institute for the History of Science in Berlin.

He has worked in research centers around the world, published in specialized journals and curated numerous exhibits

He is the author of *Pain:* A *Cultural History* (originally published in English by Palgrave MacMillan) and his title *Promesas incumplidas* was published by Taurus in 2017.

SYNOPSIS

Humans have built and used swings since the pre-imperial era in China and the time of Greek legends. It exists somewhere between art and life.

Before it was relegated to the playground, the swing was thought to have magical properties; it was used to ward off suicide and in rites of passage. It was also thought to cure tuberculosis, hysteria and impotence.

She has a BA in English and a Master's in Language and Cognitive Science. She has studied postgraduate studies in literature and publishing at the University of Dublin and Stanford University.

She worked as a literary editor until she was elected deputy within the political party En Comú Podem in the Spanish general elections of 2015. She was then appointed First Vice President of the Equality Commission.

In March 2023, she published the title **The History of Vertebrates**, in both Catalan and Spanish: an incredibly personal testimony about madness and postpartum depression in an essay on politics and motherhood.



SYNOPSIS

"On December 20, 2015 I became a mother and I lost my mind (._.) That same day, Spain voted in the first elections in which the parties participated of the so-called "new politics", and the hope of change hovered over the day. At dusk, while I was counting contractions in the dilatation room, the country counted seats.

And both counts changed my life, because one of these political seats would end up being mine. On the same day I gave birth to twin, I became deputy in Congress".

A bare-bones journey through everything the author has experienced on the road to motherhood, postpartum depression, and politics; a journey through art, literature and the history of medicine.

This is a tale of how one woman's anxiety and madness take their hold when she must take care of her new-born babies. As if that were not enough, added to this pressure is the enormous responsibility to give voice to the citizens who have entrusted their vote to represent them in a new political post. The weight of the world rests on her shoulders in a period of maximum fragility.

This story recounts the struggles of the protagonist, who fights with her body to accept the new reality that she is confronted with. The author spins her narration with countless literary references on the relationship between women and medicine; women and their bodies; women and madness. How at the moment children are born, their parents lives are changed forever.

To support her story, the author relies on the countless testimonies of other women, known and unknown, who went through that same period of delirium, so often touted as "milk mania" or "baby blues".




NADIA CELIS SALGADO
